1. Introduction

Deliverable 2.1, 'Five-day exchange visits' concerns the exchange visits to the EU and 3rd country associated to the programme partners, which were planned and organised to integrate five-day thematic agendas of observation of best practices and training on academic recognition and procedures. Four academic staff members from Albanian and Kosovo partners participated in the 5-day thematic visit to UP, organised in Olomouc on 12-16 February 2024, by the UP team, and four more from each participated in the 5-day visit to UKLO, organised in Ohrid on 26 February – 1 March 2024, by the UKLO team.

The exchange visits were combined with training workshops on mobility recognition practices in order to learn from good practices and build the capacities of academic staff from WB HEIs participating in MORIN so that they can implement them in their own institutional settings. The training workshops interactively engaged both host and guest participants. A link to a satisfaction survey was sent to participating WB academic staff to provide responses and feedback, useful to improve the content for the upcoming webinars.

The visit to UP was thematically structured around the topic of academic recognition of study periods abroad. Examples from various mobility-related practices implemented at UP, in particular the Faculty of Arts, were brought to the attention of the audience. The training content of the workshops was proposed to highlight intervention areas for improvement identified in the 'state-of-the-art' review report related to recognition via LOs for curriculum transparency and comparability. The second visit, which was organised by UKLO, was thematically structured on the topic of LOs for student-centred learning for a skills-oriented approach, benefiting the recognition of study periods abroad and impacting student participants long-term. Guest speakers inside and outside the consortium shared their experiences with mobility, which made the sessions more diverse and lovely. Concrete examples were discussed in order to make sessions more practical and concrete, based on real scenarios.
